
ENG 344 - LITERATURE OF AFRICA Dr. Raouf Mama Wednesdays 4:00-6:45pm

OSONDU, THIS COURSE WILL HELP EXPAND YOUR LITERARY HORIZONS AND EXPLODE FAMILIAR PREJUDICES AND MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT AFRICA AND AFRICANS. MORE IMPORTANT, IT WILL ENLARGE YOUR SYMPATHIES AND SHARPEN YOUR COMMUNICATIVE AND CRITICAL THINKING SKILLS.
